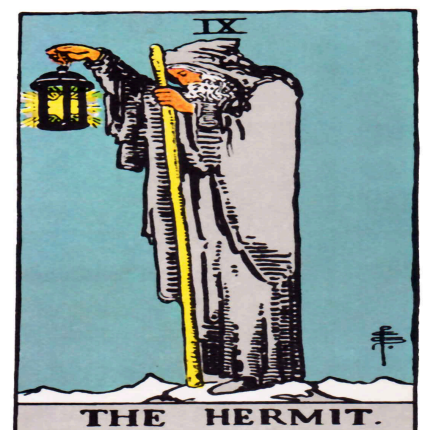
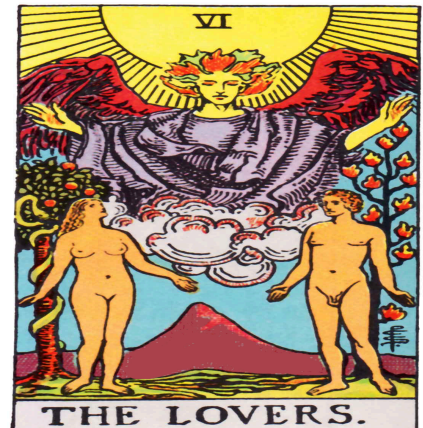
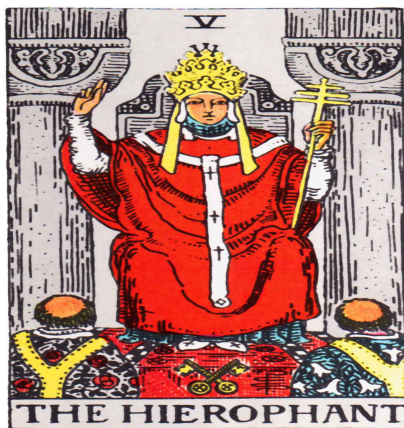


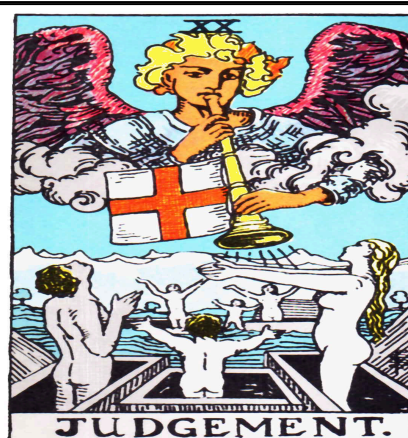
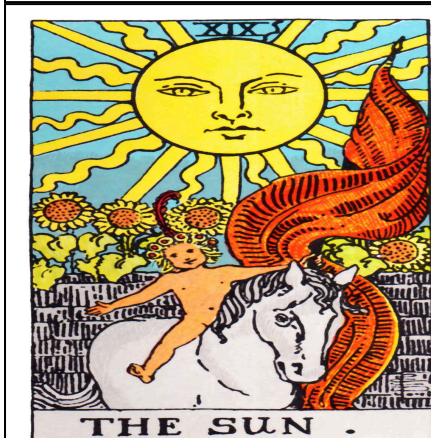
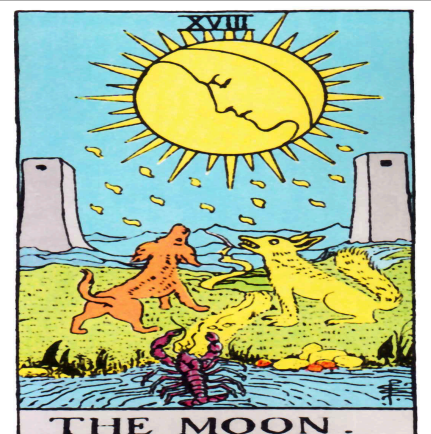
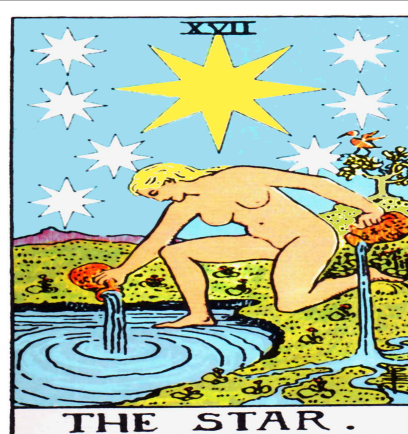
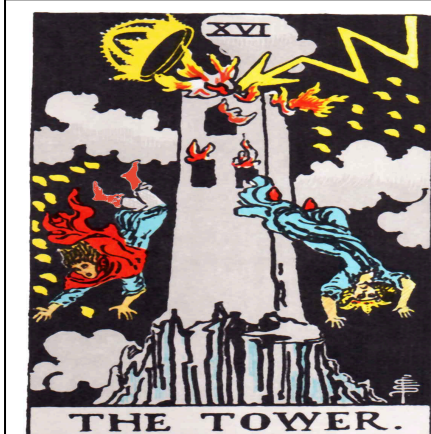
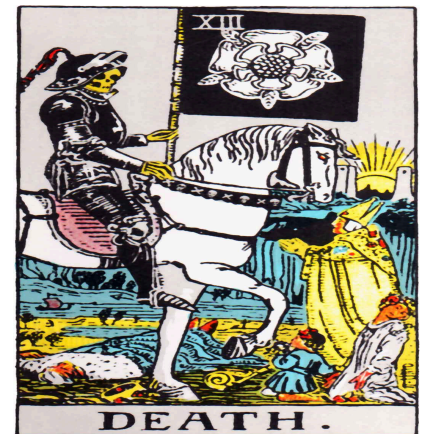
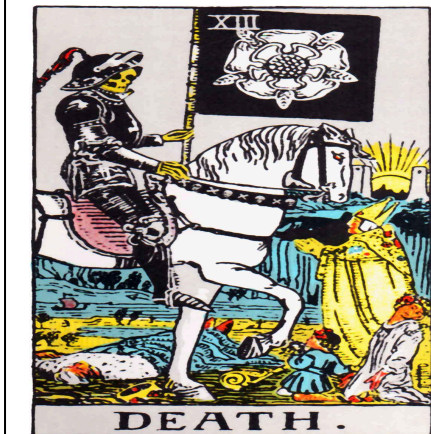
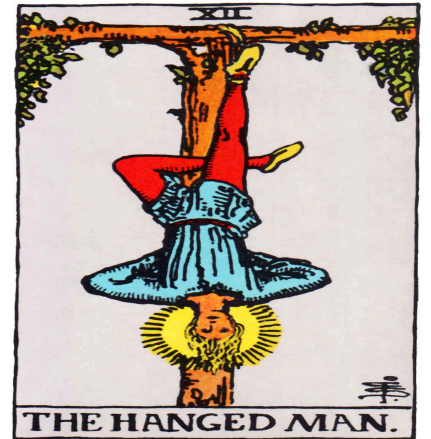
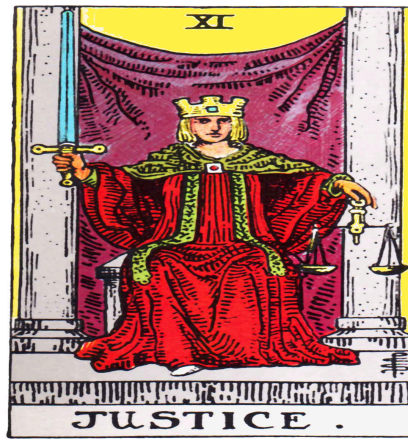
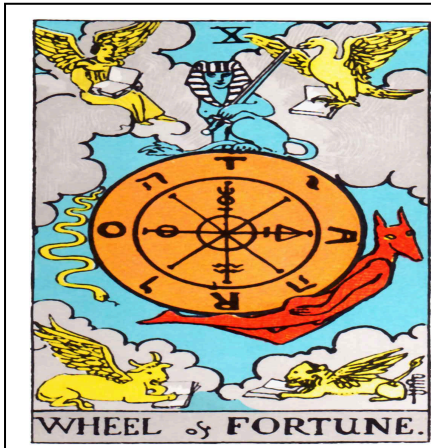


Memory Game with Rider-Waite-Smith (RWS) Tarot
